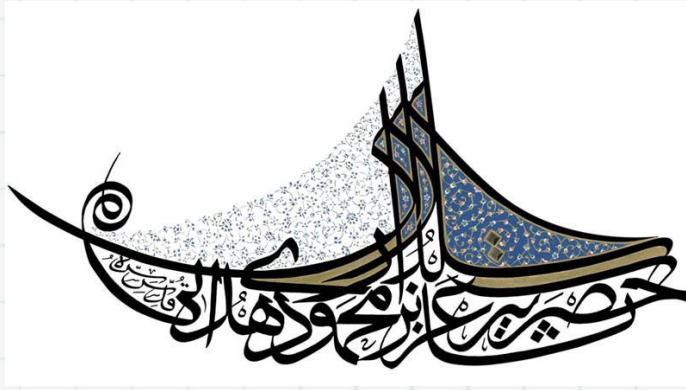

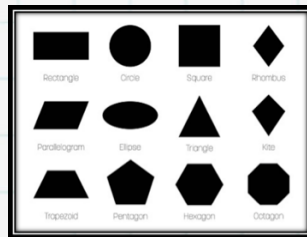
OTTOMAN CALLIGRAPHY

ONE OF TURKISH TRADITIONAL
ARTS:

Calligraphy means 'hat' in Turkish. And the word hat means "line" in Arabic language. Calligraphy is a handicraft while calligrapher is the person who performs the art of calligraphy.



Calligraphy appeared with differentiation of Arabic letters. It includes Arabic letters and shapers.



The Islamic calligraphy is based on the Qur'an, its chapters and verses. The art of calligraphy was very popular in the Ottoman Empire.

The Ottoman Empire used calligraphy in mosques, caravanserais, Turkish baths and minarets.

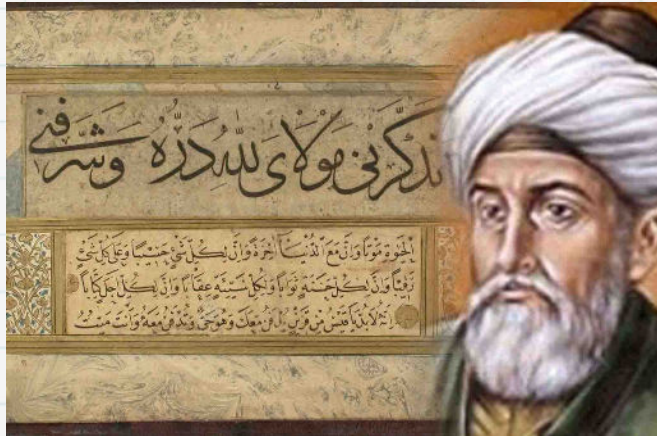

After its conquest by Turks, Istanbul became the perpetual center of Islamic calligraphy. This fact is agreed upon across the whole Islamic World and was expressed best with the following words: "The Holy Quran descended in Hijaz, was recited in Egypt and written in Istanbul". Everyone who was interested in the art had to visit Istanbul to learn the delicacy of this refined Ottoman art.

There were a lot of calligraphers in the Ottoman Empire. Sheikh Hamdullah (the great 15th-century Ottoman innovator of the art) could be regarded as the founder of the Turkish calligraphy art.



Some other prominent calligraphers are Ahmed Karahisari, Hafiz Osman, Mustafa Rakim, Mahmut Celaleddin Efendi and Yesarizade Mustafa Izzet Efendi.

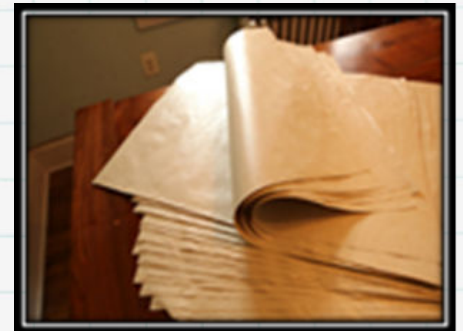

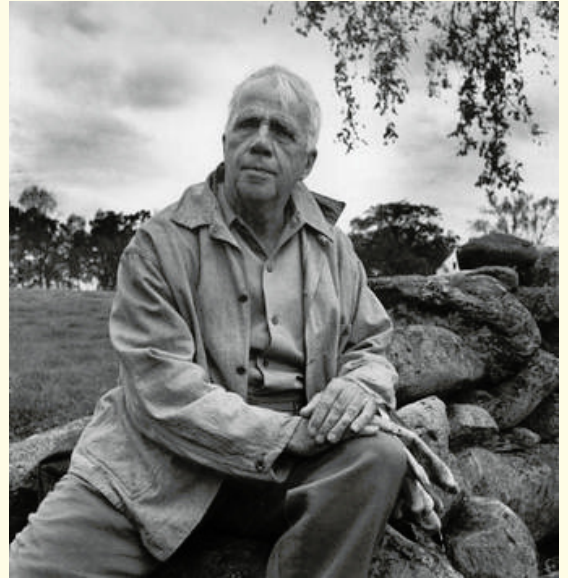

ENGLISH POETRY

ROBERT FROST



Biography

Robert Frost was born on March 26, 1874 in San Francisco, California to William Prescott Frost Jr., a journalist and his wife, Isabelle Moodie Frost. In 1885 William Frost contracted tuberculosis which led to his death, causing Isabelle Frost to move with her children to Lawrence, Massachusetts and live with the children's paternal grandparents. Robert Frost graduated from high school in 1892 as co-valedictorian along with Elinor White. Frost went on to attend Dartmouth College, but he dropped out in less than a year. In 1894, Frost had his first poem published, "My Butterfly, an Elegy" in The Independent. Frost married Elinor White in 1895 and started teaching and farming. In 1897, Frost went back to college at Harvard University, but was not much more successful, dropping out after two years. After this, Frost lived and worked on a farm near Derry, New Hampshire, but he did not make much money from it, so he also taught at a school in Derry. While Frost was on the farm, he continued to write poetry, but he did not have success in publishing his poems.

With hopes of better luck with his poetry, Frost set out for England in 1912. He lived on a farm in Beaconsfield and continued to write poetry while farming. In 1913, Frost published his first book, *A Boy's Will*, a collection of poems. In 1914, Frost published another collection of poems named *North of Boston*. During this time, Frost began to gain popularity in both England and in America. By the time Frost moved back to the United States in 1915, Frost was famous and had many magazines wanting to publish his works. Frost then bought a farm at Franconia, New Hampshire and taught at the University of Michigan and Amherst College while continuing to write poetry. Frost published his third book, *Mountain Interval*, in 1916. This was followed by *New Hampshire* in 1923, *Frost's Collected Poems* in 1930, *A Further Range* in 1936, and *A Witness Tree* in 1942, all of which earned the Pulitzer Prize. Frost also published other books including *West-Running Brook*, *Steeple Bush*, and *In the Clearing*. Frost also received other honors including his recitation of "The Gift Outright" at the inauguration of President John F. Kennedy in 1961. Robert Frost died only a few years later on January 29, 1963 in Boston, Massachusetts.

To where it bent in the undergrowth;

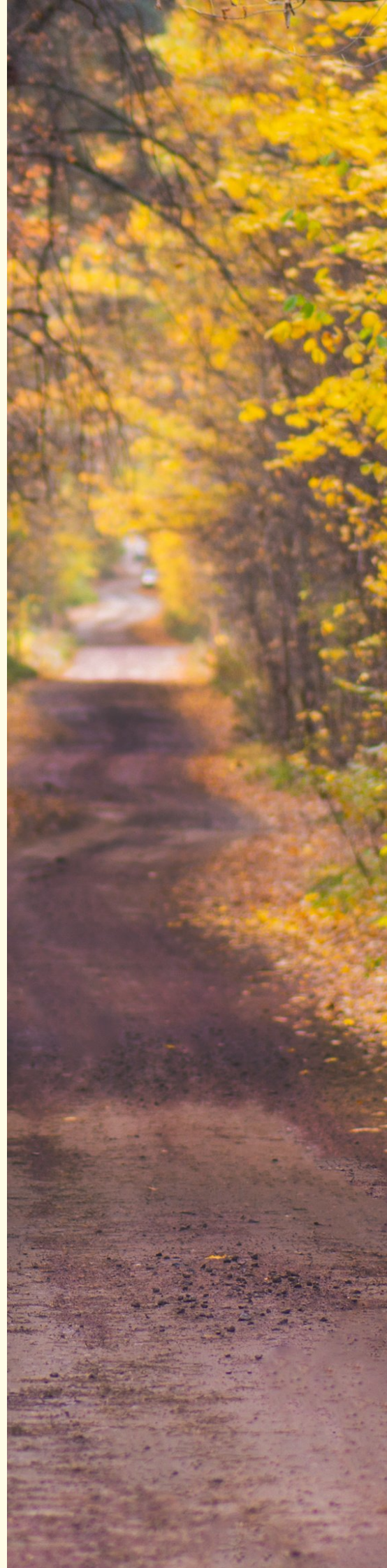
Then took the other, as just as fair,

Still pretty winter

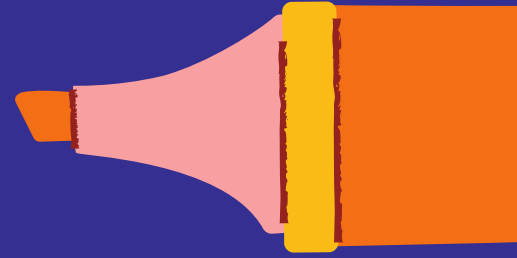
Streets get quieter

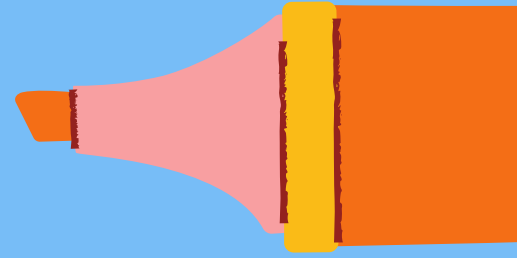

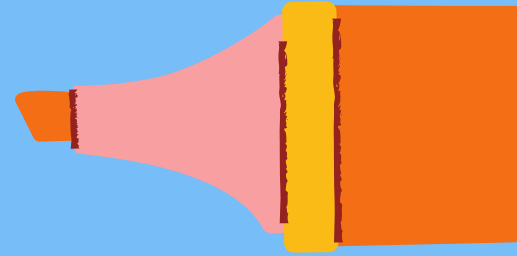
HAPPY TEACHER'S DAY

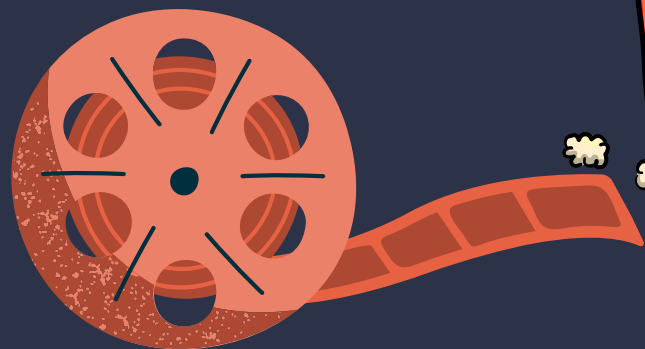


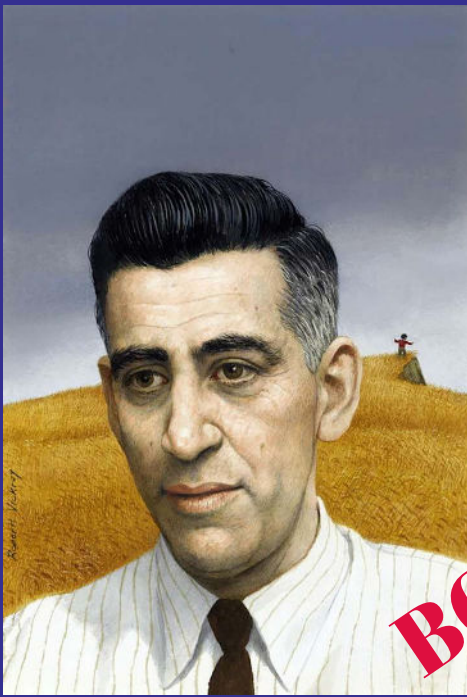
Imagine what happens when you say "yes" to all the wishes of your children for only one day...

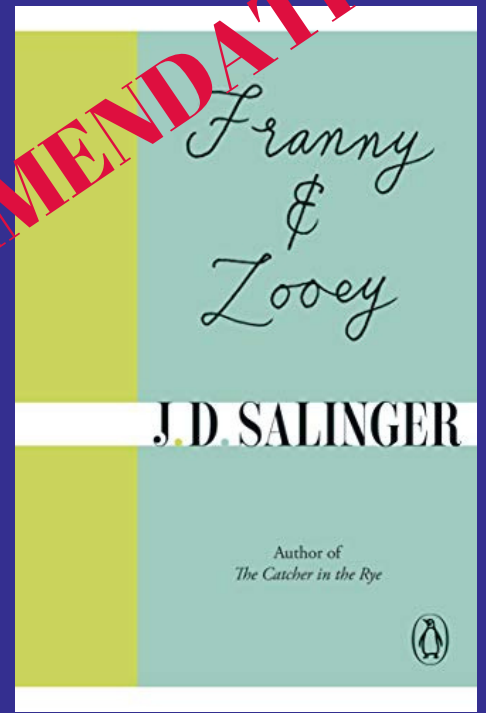

J. D. SALINGER



Franny and Zooey is a book by American author J. D. Salinger which comprises his short story "Franny" and novella Zooey. The two works were published together as a book in 1961, having originally appeared in *The New Yorker* in 1955 and 1957 respectively. The book focuses on siblings Franny and Zooey, the two youngest members of the Glass family, which was a frequent focus of Salinger's writings.

"Franny" tells the story of Franny Glass, Zooey's sister, undergraduate at a small liberal arts college, probably Wellesley College. The story takes place in an unnamed college town during Franny's weekend visit to her boyfriend Lane. Disenchanted with the selfishness and inauthenticity she perceives all around her, she aims to escape it through spiritual means.

Zooey is set shortly after "Franny" in the Glass family apartment in New York City's Upper East Side. While actor Zooey's younger sister Franny suffers a spiritual and existential breakdown in their parents' Manhattan living room, leaving their mother Bessie deeply concerned, Zooey comes to Franny's aid, offering what she thinks is brotherly love, understanding, and words of sage advice.
